

# Final Appeals by Smith and Hoover On WFAA Monday

## Campaign to Close With Four Radio Talks by Both Parties.

Gov. Alfred E. Smith and Herbert Hoover will make their final appeals to the voters Monday night (election eve) in broadcasts through the NBC network, including station WFAA, The Dallas News and The Dallas Journal.

Mr. Hoover will speak for one hour, starting at 8 p. m. His address will be delivered at his home, Palo Alto, Cal. Governor Smith's last word will be heard from 9 to 10 p. m. from New York City. Perhaps the final political exhortation of the contest will be made from the Republican camp with a speaker on the radio at 10 p. m. Monday to follow Governor Smith. The speaker has not yet been named. A Democratic spokesman will be heard at 8:30 a. m. Monday and a Republican orator at 11 a. m.

### Roxy Hour.

Harold C. Wright, youthful artist and one of the recent recruits to Roxy's Gang, will be heard in several baritone solos during the program to be broadcast through the NBC system and WFAA at 7 p. m. Monday. Mr. Wright is but 23 years old and has drawn praise for a voice of unusual richness and power. Other vocalists will be presented during this program and selections will be heard from the symphony orchestra and instrumental soloists.

### Marjorie Hazelwood.

Marjorie Hazelwood, singer and pianist, using classics and light ballads, will entertain in WFAA's Baker Hotel studios at 2:30 p. m. Monday. This hour is now a regular feature of the station in response to the requests of many listeners.

### New Network Program.

Station WFAA will present a new network program at 5:30 p. m. Monday. The first in a series of "Gilbert Sports Talk for Boys" will be broadcast through the associated stations of the NBC system at 5:30 p. m. Monday.

This program is planned primarily for boys but should prove interesting to grown-ups as well. Mr. Gilbert, president of the A. C. Gilbert company, and the Erector Buddies, a musical group of twenty, will be featured on this date.

The subject of this first program is the 1928 Olympic games. Mr. Gilbert, a member of the United States Olympic committee, will tell what he saw at Amsterdam, while the Erector Buddies will reproduce much of the music that was heard in the Amsterdam Stadium.

### Mrs. Rather to Sing.

Cecile Dunavant Rather, rich-voiced contralto, will be heard at 2:30 p. m. in ballads and old favorites.

### Sandman Soldiers.

The Sandman Soldiers will parade at 5 p. m. Monday and at that hour each Monday because of new network programs. This is a half hour earlier than usual.
